So you're a better science writer.

Now what?

Why you should write:

For scientists:

Puts you in control

Coverage is good (and often compulsory)

For communicators:

Builds your portfolio

Gets you experience

Sweet side gig (but awful full-time job)

Things to do before you write

Setting up to freelance

Please get paid (if you can)!

Get an ABN (it's not that hard)

You're probably* a sole trader

You probably* don't need to register for GST

why write?

Get a nice email address.

your.name@gmail.com is fine

contact@yourname.com is amazing

(crazy.bananas.69@hotmail.com is not ok)

Your student email vanishes when you graduate!

after you write

Looking the part

Get a portfolio...

medium.com/yourname is fine yourname.com is amazing

...and use it!

A very short blurb about you, your qualifications, your expertise, your interests

after you write

A highlights reel (your ~3 best pieces)

Everything else you've written

rockym93 dot net

index blog code text misc

What's your angle?

What do they publish?

Who is their target audience?

What is their tone and style?

Who are you?

why write?

Two sentences, tops

Mention any relevant expertise

Where can they find some work samples?

after you write

What's your story?

why write?

What's your topic?

What is your hook, your angle, your 'nut graph'?

after you write

Why is it newsworthy or important?

Why should *they* run this story?

Why should *you* write it for them?

What can you bring?

why write?

Who will you interview?

Do you already have quotes?

Do you have media to go with it? Photos? Videos?

What else can you offer?

Infographics? Amazing art skills? Interactives? Social followers?

after you write

Access to experts or unreleased papers (but be careful!)

after you write

why write?

What do they need to do?

When should they get back to you?

How many words do they want?

What kind of deadline do they want?

Do they need you to sign a contract?

Your pitch needs to showcase your writing.

why write?

It's okay to follow up, but don't be annoying.

It's okay to pitch somewhere else, but tell them.

after you write

A no is no to this piece, not to you as a writer.

If you get commissioned, stick to your brief.

The fun part: write your thing!

After you submit

They will tell you what to do.

Some places will send you revisions

Some places will edit your piece for you

You can suggest a headline, but they might change it.

Once they accept it, you should send an invoice.

Invoicing*

- The word 'invoice'
- The date it was issued

before you write

- Your details & ABN
- Their details
- What you sold them
- How much it cost
- What the total is (& GST)
- How they can pay you

Invoicing*

Don't forget to include it on your tax return!

There's a section for sole trader income.

It's pretty easy as a side gig, but talk to an accountant if you end up hitting the big leagues.

When the piece is published

They probably own the copyright now. :(

Share it – more views makes you look good

Put it on your portfolio

If it's your (or a friend's) research, be prepared for more enquiries.

Rinse and repeat!

Where to publish?

If your story isn't picked up, write it anyway.

Run your own site.

Publish straight to your portfolio.

Medium (<u>medium.com</u>) has great network effects.
